India in a 'much better' to face Trump-era trade disruptions: ITC chairman Sanjiv Puri

India is in a 'much better' place to deal with the global trade disruptions caused by the actions of the Trump administration as it continues to be driven by domestic consumption, ITC chairman Sanjiv Puri said. Puri, who is also the president of the CII, believed that India would be able to weather the storm as it is already in discussions with multiple trade partners such as the US, the UK and the EU to forge bilateral deals which will facilitate trade and investment.

On April 2, US President Donald Trump imposed reciprocal tariffs on many countries, including India, which he postponed by three months on June 9 with the exception of China, which continues to face a 145 per cent tariff. However, a 10 per cent additional duty on exports from all countries to the US is still in place. The so-called reciprocal tariffs have been suspended until July 9.

When asked about the impact

of such tariffs on the domestic industry, Puri said it will be difficult to say how it will evolve, but India will be 'much better' placed in this. "It's difficult to say how it will evolve, but my own sense is that at the end of it, I think India is going to be much better placed, because I do see the possibility of several FTAs (free trade agreements) being inked, which industry has been looking forward to for some time, hopefully during



the year, whether it's the EU, the UK, and, of course, the US, where there is, I think discussions, dialogue happening at a faster rate," Puri said while speaking at a fireside chat — Resilience and Growth in the

New World Disorder — at the AIMA summit.

India and the US have been engaged in negotiating a bilateral trade agreement since March. Both sides have targeted to conclude the first phase of the pact by fall (September-October) of this year with an aim to more than double the bilateral trade to \$500 billion by 2030. Puri argued India's domestic consumption driven economy would not be hit much.

"So while short-term uncertainty, unpredictability may be causing some kind of impact on global growth also... a consequent little impact on India — because it is a consumption driven economy —will be also there," he said.

Commenting on the impact on ITC, Puri observed that it is also a "more domestic-focused industry" but admitted it may face some impact due to the US tariffs.

Bank Credit Growth Likely To Rise To 12-13% In FY26, Says Crisil

Mumbai: Given the recent supportive regulatory measures, a boost to consumption from tax cuts and softer interest rates, bank credit is likely to grow 100 to 200 basis points (bps) on-year to 12 to 13 per cent this fiscal year (FY26), compared with 11 to 11.5 per cent estimated for fiscal 2025, as per a report.

Crisil Ratings, in its report, stated that deposit growth, a crucial support for credit growth, bears watching. The report highlighted that two key regulatory changes are expected to support bank credit growth. It noted that as the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has rolled back the 25 percentage points' (pps) increase in the risk weights for bank loans to certain categories of non-banking financial companies (NBFCs), this will improve the credit flow to NBFCs.

The banking system's exposure to NBFCs had risen at a compound annual growth rate of around 21 per cent over fiscals 2023 and 2024 but fell sharply to an estimated around six per cent in fiscal 2025, the report highlighted.

"Credit growth in the corporate sector, which accounts for around 41 per cent of bank loans, is expected to be 9 to 10 per cent, compared with eight per cent estimated for fiscal 2025, as lending to NBFCs—one of the largest sub-segments of corporate credit and a key contributor to growth prior to fiscal 2025—improves with the rollback of higher risk weights," stated Subha Sri Narayanan, Director, Crisil Ratings.

The apex bank has also deferred the implementation of the more stringent liquidity coverage ratio (LCR) norms by a year. Their implementation, as proposed, would have reduced the LCRs of most banks by 10 to 30 pps. The funds to be set aside to create the LCR cushion can now be directed towards credit growth, the report added.

The Crisil Ratings' report further noted that the income tax breaks afforded in this fiscal's Union Budget and expected benign inflation have the potential to spur consumption and thus demand for retail loans. Lower lending rates, following the 50 bps of repo rate cuts since February 2025 and another 50 bps of reductions likely this fiscal year, should also support demand for loans, it added.

Sensex, Nifty surge on global markets rally after Trump's exemption for tariffs on electronics

Mumbai (PTI): Benchmark equity indices surged in early trade on Tuesday tracking a rally in global markets as investors sentiment became buoyant after US President Donald Trump relaxed some of the tariffs on electronics for now.

The 30-share BSE benchmark Sensex jumped 1,750.37 points to 76,907.63 in early trade. The NSE Nifty surged 539.8 points to 23,368.35.

From the Sensex firms, Tata Motors rallied 5 per cent. Larsen & Toubro, HDFC Bank, Mahindra & Mahindra, ICICI Bank and IndusInd Bank were the other big gainers. Hindustan Unilever, Asian Paints, Nestle and Kotak Mahindra Bank were the laggards. In Asian markets, South Korea's Kospi index, Tokyo's Nikkei 225 and Hong Kong's Hang Seng were trading in the positive territory while Shanghai SSE Composite index quoted lower. US markets ended higher on Monday.

"Global indices across the US, Asia, and Europe gained 3–4 per cent over Friday and Monday, after the US government excluded computers, and other electronics from reciprocal tariffs. This move is being seen as a significant softening of the US stance toward China,



boosting global sentiment.

"Adding to the positive outlook, US President Donald Trump announced on Monday that he is considering exemptions on tariffs for imported vehicles and auto parts. Last week, he also declared a 90-day pause on tariffs for all countries except China, signalling a potential window for trade negotiations and easing global trade war concerns," Vikas Jain, Head of Research, Reliance Securities, said.

Foreign Institutional Investors (FIIs) offloaded equities worth Rs 2,519.03 crore on Friday, according to exchange data.

Global oil benchmark Brent crude went up by 0.09 per cent to USD 64.94 a barrel. Equity markets were closed on Monday for Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar Jayanti. The Sensex jumped 1,310.11 points or 1.77 per cent to settle at 75,157.26 on Friday. The Nifty surged 429.40 points or 1.92 per cent to 22,828.55.

Dr. Anoop Misra, a leading Indian expert, emphasized the relevance of this study for India, where rising cardiometabolic diseases are a growing concern. He noted that almonds can help manage blood glucose levels, particularly in Asian Indians

with prediabetes.

Beware of fake mosquito repellents; HICA urges vigilance amid monsoon disease surge

Guwahati: With mosquito-borne diseases on the rise during the pre-monsoon and monsoon seasons, the Home Insect Control Association (HICA) has issued an urgent advisory urging consumers to beware of counterfeit mosquito repellents flooding the market.

In a statement, Jayant Deshpande, Honorary Secretary of HICA, warned that fake or substandard repellents not only fail to protect against deadly diseases like dengue, malaria, and chikungunya, but also pose serious health risks due to unregulated and unsafe chemical formulations.

To help consumers stay protected, Deshpande outlined several key tips to identify genuine products. The most critical check is the CIR number—a Central Insecticides Board & Registration Committee (CIBRC) approval code found on every government-approved repellent. Missing, unclear, or tampered CIR numbers are red flags for counterfeits. Additionally, buyers should verify packaging for clear manufacturer details, batch numbers, expiry dates, and scannable QR codes for authenticity.

Highlighting effective formulations, Deshpande said that trusted ingredients such as Renofluthrin, Transfluthrin, picaridin, and oil of lemon eucalyptus (OLE) are scientifically backed and government-approved. Notably, Renofluthrin, India's first indigenously developed

and patented molecule, is used in Goodknight Flash liquid vapourisers, considered among the most effec-

Consumers are also advised to purchase only from reputed brands that adhere to rigorous testing protocols lasting 2–3 years before product launch. Fake repellents often come in flimsy packaging with poor print quality, exaggerated claims, and suspiciously low prices.

HICA urged consumers to report any suspected counterfeit products to the manufacturer or regulatory authorities. "By staying alert and making informed choices, families can protect themselves from the dangers of both mosquitoes and fake repellents," Deshpande said.

"Replacing deep-fried snacks with nutrient-dense options like almonds can significantly improve health outcomes," she said. Wellness expert SheelaKrishnaswamy highlighted almonds' role in satiety and weight control, while nutritionist Dr. Rohini-

Patil emphasized their benefits in blood sugar management.

Celebrity endorsements have further fueled the almond market. Bollywood actress Soha Ali Khan and South Indian star Shriya Saran swear by almonds as a daily energy booster. "A handful of almonds keeps me energized through long shoots," said Khan.

In Guwahati, health-conscious consumers are driving a surge in demand for California almonds. Retailers report an increasing shift from traditional snacks to dry fruits, reflecting growing awareness of wellness trends. With rising disposable incomes and lifestyle shifts, the city's dry fruit market is experiencing steady growth.

As the health movement gains momentum, California almonds are poised to capture a larger share of India's evolving wellness market.

Bayern Held by Dortmund, Misses Chance to Widen Bundesliga Lead



Berlin: Bayern Munich missed a golden opportunity to move eight points clear at the top of the Bundesliga as Borussia Dortmund fought back for a 2-2 draw in a thrilling edition of "der Klassiker." Bayern looked poised for a comfortable win after substitutes Serge Gnabry and Raphaël Guerreiro struck in quick succession, turning the game around following Maximilian Beier's opener for Dortmund. But a resilient Dortmund side struck back as defender Waldemar Anton netted the equalizer in the 75th minute, pouncing on a rebound after Jonas Urbig denied Serhou Guirassy's overhead attempt. Harry Kane squandered a key chance to seal the win, one of several missed by the hosts as Dortmund goalkeeper Gregor Kobel was kept busy throughout.

"A game of missed opportunities," said veteran Thomas Müller, who made a rare start and captained the side. The 35-year-old received a warm ovation pre-match, with Bayern confirming this week that his contract won't be renewed after the season. The result keeps Bayern six points ahead at the summit with five matches left, failing to fully capitalize on Bayer Leverkusen's earlier 0-0 draw against Union Berlin. Next up, Bayern will shift focus to the Champions League, needing to overturn a first-leg deficit against Inter Milan in the quarterfinals. The final will be held in Munich this May.

Salt-Kohli Gear Up for Archer Showdown as RR, RCB Aim to Rebound

Phil Salt and Virat Kohli are set to face a fiery challenge from pace ace Jofra Archer when Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) clash with Rajasthan Royals (RR) in a crucial IPL encounter on Sunday. Both teams are looking to bounce back after disappointing defeats — RCB lost to Delhi Capitals by six wickets, while RR suffered a heavy 58-run thrashing at the hands of Gujarat Titans. RCB currently sit fourth on the points table with three wins from five matches. Meanwhile, RR are struggling at seventh with just two victories in as many games.

Archer, who had a nightmare start to the season with the most expensive spell in IPL history, has bounced back in style. Hitting speeds well over 144 kph, the English speedster produced a gameturning 3/25 against Punjab Kings, including a 148.6 kph thunderbolt to dismiss an inform Shreyas Iyer. He clocked 152.3 kph against Gujarat and removed Shubman Gill with a sharp 147.7 kph in-swinger. RR will depend heavily on Archer to neutralize Kohli (186 runs) and his English teammate Salt (143 runs), a dangerous opening duo capable of shifting momentum within a few overs.

While Kohli has had a patchy campaign despite two fifties, Salt has been in aggressive touch from the start. Kohli's measured approach alongside Salt's explosiveness gives RCB a balanced top order. Devdutt Padikkal will also look to make a strong statement after



a quiet run. RCB will count on the in-form Rajat Patidar as skipper, with finishers like Tim David and Liam Livingstone expected to do damage in the death overs. Their pace attack, led by Josh Hazlewood and Bhuvneshwar Kumar, remains a strength, though their spinners need to step up. For RR, a strong batting response is vital after their collapse for 159 against GT. With Sanju

Samson, Riyan Parag, Yashasvi Jaiswal, and Nitish Rana up top, and the likes of Dhruv Jurel and Shimron Hetmyer down the order, the Royals have plenty of firepower. But with only Sandeep Sharma holding up the bowling end consistently, Archer's resurgence couldn't have come at a better time for RR. Match begins at 3:30 PM IST.

Struggling CSK Seek Revival Against In-Form LSG

Lucknow: Reeling from their worst-ever run in IPL history, a desperate Chennai Super Kings (CSK) will hope to break their losing streak when they face an inform Lucknow Super Giants (LSG) in a must-win clash on Monday. For the first time, CSK have suffered five consecutive losses, including an unprecedented three defeats at their Chepauk stronghold. Even the return of MS Dhoni as skipper, stepping in for the injured Ruturaj Gaikwad, couldn't prevent their latest loss on Friday.

With their top-order struggling—especially against spin—the away fixture might be a welcome change. But the absence of Gaikwad, their most consistent batter, only deepens their woes. Criticism has mounted over CSK's continued reliance on aging players, with their lack of firepower a ma-jor concern. Dhoni admitted that even aiming for 60 runs in the powerplay feels overly optimistic with this lineup. Rachin Ravindra and Devon Conway are technically solid but not known for explosive starts. Rahul Tripa-thi, stepping in at No. 3, is under pressure to deliver immediately. The team also needs more impact from experienced all-rounder Ravindra Jadeja.

Shivam Dube remains CSK's most aggressive option, but he needs support— possibly from Dhoni himself. However, with the former India

captain batting as low as No. 9 in the last game, the chances of him mak-ing a meaningful contribution are limited. Despite the slump, CSK batting coach Mike Hussey remains hopeful. "We're not giving up. We still believe we've got the right players. We don't want them to completely change their natural game," Hussey said after the defeat to KKR. Meanwhile, LSG are riding a wave of momentum with three straight wins and increasing consistency. Initially let down by injuries in their bowling unit, LSG have turned things around, thanks to impressive performances from Avesh Khan, Ravi Bishnoi, and Shardul Thakur. The trio successfully choked Gujarat Titans in the final overs on Saturday, showcasing their growing strength.

The Lucknow pitch, once known for being sluggish, has turned batter-friendly—a boost for Nicholas Pooran, who is in sublime hitting form. LSG's batting order remains fluid. With Mitchell Marsh missing the last game, Rishabh Pant opened alongside the in-form Aiden Markram. Pant looked steady at the top, but with Marsh expected to return, it remains to be seen whether Pant continues as an opener or returns to the middle order. The stage is set for a crucial battle—CSK fight for survival, while LSG aim to extend their winning run.

CSK Suffer Humiliating 8-Wicket Defeat to KKR, Face 3rd Consecutive Loss at Chepauk

Chennai: In a crushing defeat, Chennai Super Kings (CSK) endured an 8-wicket loss to Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) on Friday, marking their third consecutive loss at the iconic Chepauk Stadium for the first time in IPL history. The MS Dhoniled side, already grappling with a tough season, slumped to their fifth straight defeat, continuing their downward spiral in this edition of the IPL. CSK's batting woes were once again on full display as they were bundled out for just 103/9, their lowest total at Chepauk and the lowest total of the season so far. The innings was marked by a lack of partner-ships, and despite a gritty effort from Shivam Dube, who topscored with an unbeaten 31 off 29 balls, CSK struggled to find any rhythm. Vijay Shankar also contributed 29, but the rest of the lineup failed to make significant contributions. The team could manage only nine boundaries throughout their innings.

KKR's bowlers were in complete control, with Sunil Narine (3/13) leading the charge. He was wellsupported by Harshit Rana and Varun Chakravarthy, who took two wickets each. Moeen Ali and Rana removed key CSK batters early, and Narine also played a pivotal role in dismantling the home side. CSK's powerplay struggles continued, as they could only score 31 runs for the loss of two wickets. A brief part-nership between Shankar and Dube provided some hope, but CSK's innings fell apart as wickets continued to tumble. The collapse was swift, with CSK at 71/6 by the 12th over.

Mohun Bagan Clinch Historic ISL Double with Final Win Over Bengaluru FC

Kolkata: Mohun Bagan Super Giant (MBSG) etched their name in Indian Super League (ISL) his-tory on Saturday by securing a memorable double, lifting the ISL Cup with a thrilling 2-1 extra-time win over Bengaluru FC to add to

the League Winners' Shield they had already claimed earlier this season. In front of a packed Salt Lake Stadium, MBSG overcame an early second-half setback, rallying from an own goal to seal the win in extra time. With this victory, they became only the second team in ISL history — after Mumbai City in the 2020-21 season — to win both the Shield and Cup in the same campaign.

The League Winners' Shield is awarded to the team finishing first

in the league standings after 24 matches. MBSG topped the table with 56 points to secure their AFC Champions League 2 berth and a spot in the playoffs. After progressing past the knockout stages, they met Bengaluru FC in Saturday's

title decider. The final was a tense affair. After a goalless first half, the deadlock was broken in the 49th minute when MBSG defender Alberto Rodríguez turned a cross into his own net under pressure, giving Bengaluru FC a surprise lead.
