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Indian stock market rebounds with strong gains, Sensex jumps 1,006 points

Mumbai: The Indian stock market bounced back strongly on Monday despite geo-political tensions, with the benchmark indices ending the day on a robust note. The rally was driven primarily by a surge in the strong performance from select banking stocks and hopes of a new India-US trade deal. The Sensex opened with a positive gap of about 120 points, starting at 79,344. As the day progressed, the index continued to climb, reaching a fresh high for the year at 80,322 before closing at 80,218, up by 1,006 points, or 1.27 per cent.

This marked a significant recovery for the index. Similarly, the Nifty index also saw a positive movement, swinging between 24,054 and 24,355, and settling at 24,329, up by 289 points, or 1.2 per cent. "On the higher end, 24,360 has remained a resistance level, and the Nifty might spend some more time around the current range unless 24,360 is decisively breached," Rupak De of LKP Securities said.

He added that above 24,360, the index could move towards 24,550, where the 61.80 per cent Fibonacci retracement



level of the previous fall from 26,277 to 21,743 lies. Major banking stocks such as ICI-CI Bank, HDFC Bank, Axis Bank, and SBI contributed

significantly to the market's strong performance, together adding up to 340 points to the Sensex. These top four stocks made up nearly 75 per cent of

the day's total gains.

Among the individual gainers, Sun Pharma, Mahindra Mahindra, Tata Steel, SBI, Axis Bank, Tata Motors, and Larsen and Toubro all saw an increase of 2-3 per cent in their stock prices. However, some stocks like HCL Technologies, UltraTech Cement, Hindustan Unilever, and Eternal faced losses, with HCL Technologies falling nearly 2 per cent. In the broader market, the BSE MidCap index rose by 1.4 per cent, while the SmallCap index gained 0.4

Adani Total Gas clocks 15 pc operational revenue growth in Q4, volume up 13 pc

Ahmedabad: India's leading energy transition company Adani Total Gas Limited (ATGL) on Monday reported strong results, with revenue from operations increasing by 15 per cent at Rs 1,448 crore in Q4 FY25. For the entire FY25, operational revenue rose by 12 per cent on account of higher volume, primarily on CNG segment. The volume went up 13 per cent in Q4 FY25 and 15 per cent year-on-year in FY25. The company earned a consolidated PAT of Rs 155 crore in Q4. In the January-March period, the company added 42 new CNG stations to reach 647, while expanding PNG home connections to 9.63 lakh, adding 40,991 new households.

It expanded its footprint to 3,401 installed electric vehicle (EV) charging points across 26 states/UTs. "During the year, Team ATGL has continued its thrust to expand access of PNG and CNG to large masses.

India's industrial growth clocks 3 per cent growth in March



New Delhi: India's industrial growth, based on the Index of Industrial Production (IIP), edged up to 3 per cent in March this year after slowing to 2.9 per cent in February, according to data released by the Ministry of Statistics on Monday. The data showed that the manufacturing sector, which provides quality jobs for the country's young graduates passing out of the country's universities and engineering institutes, recorded a 3 per cent growth in March compared to the same month last year. The power sector output grew by a more robust 6.3 per cent growth during the month while the mining sector proved to be a laggard with a mere 0.4 per cent growth in March.

New iPhone plant starts production in southern India, another to begin shipments in May

Mumbai: A new plant making iPhones in southern India has started production and another will begin shipments in May, as Apple looks to boost manufacturing beyond its tariff-hit main manufacturing hub, China, sources said.

Apple is positioning India as an alternative manufacturing base to China as a trade war flares between Washington and Beijing, with U.S. President Donald Trump's more than 100 per cent tariffs on China threatening supply chain disruptions and stoking fears of a rise in iPhone prices. The Trump administration has so far spared China-made electronics from tariffs, but Washington has signalled that some levies could come in the coming weeks.

A new Tata Electronics plant in Hosur in south India's Tamil Nadu state started operations in recent days to make older iPhone models on one assembly line, one source said.

Another \$2.6 billion plant run by Taiwan's Foxconn that is under construction in Bengaluru will also start initial operations with one assembly line within days, according to four sources, including one government official.

One source said around 300-500 iPhone units per hour can be made at the



factory where, according to another, iPhone 16 and 16e models will be produced.

The plant is expected to create 50,000 jobs at full capacity when construction is fully completed, which is expected by December 2027. Tata declined to comment, while Apple and Foxconn did not immediately respond to requests for comment.

China accounts for more than 75 per cent of iPhone production globally, while India contributes to about 18 per cent, research firm Counterpoint estimates.

Apple is taking urgent steps to move production of most of its US-sold iPhones to factories in India by the end of 2026, Reuters has reported.

Apple in recent weeks has stepped up production in India to beat US tariffs, shipping some 600 tonnes of iPhones worth \$2 billion to the US in March, a monthly record for both Tata and Foxconn, with the latter alone accounting for smartphones worth \$1.3 billion.

PV sector to hit record volumes, EV gains stay modest amid high costs, range worries

Mumbai: The passenger vehicle industry in India is expected to touch a record cumulative domestic and export volume of 50 lakh units this fiscal despite the annual growth rate slowing down to 2-4 per cent, according to Crisil Ratings.

However, penetration of electric vehicles (EVs) is seen at a moderate 3-3.5 per cent despite launches and declining battery costs because of high prices, modest charging infrastructure and range anxiety, restricting the market to urban users as a second car option, the analytics firm said in a statement.

The growth in the EV segment has slowed after doubling last year on a low base, it added. This marks the fourth consecutive year of record sales, although momentum has significantly eased from the 25 per cent surge in fiscal 2023 after the pandemic. The domestic market accounted for about 85 per cent of total volumes last fiscal, with exports accounting for the rest, Crisil Ratings said.



The entry of global premium EV models, including Tesla would intensify competition in the premium segment, which accounts for less than 10 per cent of the overall volume. This will likely reset consumer expectations across categories, pushing Indian Original Equipment Manufacturer (OEMs) to accelerate technology upgrades, Crisil Ratings said. Going ahead, the pace of interest rate cuts and EV adoption, as well as potential supply shocks could impact the availability of chips and battery cells.

Spotify rolls out \$100 milion push to chip away rival turf, lure video podcasters from YouTube

Mumbai: Spotify has paid more than \$100 million to podcast publishers and creators since January, the company told The New York Times' DealBook.

The payout is the result of a program introduced this year that opened new revenue streams to eligible hosts. But it is also an attempt to draw more creators (and their audiences) to Spotify, as the rise of video podcasting has driven many of them to YouTube.

Video has come to dominate podcasting. More than half of Americans older than 12 have watched a video podcast — but primarily on YouTube, according to an Edison Research report from January. The service claims to reach 1 billion podcast consumers every month, making it the dominant platform for podcasts — a media king and kingmaker — and leaving onetime audio-only platforms like Spotify and Apple Podcasts in the dust.

(Spotify introduced video podcasts in 2019.)

Compared with YouTube, Spotify has become a podcast underdog, with about 170 million monthly podcast listeners among its total audience of 675 million. One indication of how far Spotify has to go to catch up to the top player: YouTube paid out more than \$70 billion to creators and media companies from 2021 to 2024. The company reports earnings Tuesday and is expected to make about 540 million euros (about \$616,000) in pretax income on 4.2 billion euros in sales, according to S&P Capital IO.

The new partner programme aims to chip away at YouTube's dominance. Spotify previously paid creators only by sharing advertising revenue with them, much like YouTube. Now it also gives them incentives to upload videos, with eligible creators earning additional money based on how much premium subscribers engage with their videos.

Picking up the ball in-side her own half, she drove at pace down the right flank before rifling a low, curling shot into the top-corner from just outside the area. Two minutes before halftime, Caroline Graham Hansen's precise cross found Poland captain Ewa Pajor, who converted from close range to make it 2-0. Early in the sec-ond half, Clàudia Pina added a third with a superb curled finish from the edge of the box, and Salma Par-alluelo wrapped up the rout in stoppage time, stabbing in the rebound after Niko Karelis saw two attempts blocked by desperate Chelsea defending. Chelsea, who had themselves shot ahead in the first leg, managed a stoppage-time consolation goal through Dutch midfielder Wieke Kaptein, but it proved little more than a footnote to Barcelona's domi-nance. The win extended Barcelona's unbeaten run in all competitions to nine matches and increased their goal tally in this Champions League campaign to an astonishing 44 strikes.

Barcelona will now await the winner of Sunday's semi-final second leg between Lyon and Arsenal in Lyon, where the French side held a 2-1 advantage from the first match. The final is scheduled for May 24 at Lisbon's 50,000-seat Estádio José Alvalade. Lyon and Barcelona have already met in three of the last six finals, promising another high-stakes show-down.

Mohun Bagan, FC Goa Secure Super Cup Semifinal Spots with Wins



Bhubaneswar: Mohun Bagan Super Giant (MBSG) and FC Goa advanced to the Super Cup semi-finals with victories over Kerala Blasters and Punjab FC, respectively, in exciting encounters on Saturday. MBSG, the Indian Super League Shield and Cup winners, triumphed 2-1 over Kerala Blasters, with goals in each half from Sahal Abdul Samad (22nd minute) and Suhail Ahmad Bhat (51st minute). Kerala Blasters' Sreekuttan MS pulled one back in injury time (90+4), but it was too late to change the outcome, sending MBSG into the semifinals.

In the later match, FC Goa produced a dramatic late comeback to defeat Punjab FC 2-1. Punjab FC had taken the lead through Ezequiel Vidal in the 57th minute, but quickfire goals from Borja Herrera and Mohammed Yasir in the dying minutes (88th and 90th minutes) secured a thrilling turnaround for FC Goa. The match between Mohun Bagan and Kerala Blasters started slowly, with both teams hesitant to commit men forward early on. The first real chance came in the 22nd minute when MBSG made their break-through. Salahudheen Adnan beat his marker Naocha Singh and delivered a perfect cross into the six-yard box, where Samad latched onto it and chipped the ball over Kerala goalkeeper Sachin Suresh to make it 1-0.

The Blasters responded with some attacking intent but failed to convert their chances. Noah Sadaoui's long-range effort was comfortably saved by MBSG goalkeeper Dheeraj Singh, and a series of dangerous corners from Kerala saw Hormipam's header tipped over by Dheeraj, and Sadaoui's low cross cleared off the line. As the second half began, Kerala's hopes were dashed early when Mohun Bagan added another. Ashique Kuruniyan made a blistering run down the left and crossed perfectly for Bhat, who tapped it in for a 2-0 lead. Kerala Blasters had several more opportunities to get back into the game, including two missed chances from Jesus Jimenez, but Dheeraj's stellar goalkeeping.

kept them at bay. The Mohun Bagan goalkeeper was also called into action to deny Kwame Peprah and Jimenez in the final stages. Despite the late consolation goal from Sreekuttan, which was set up by Jimenez in the 94th minute, MBSG held on for a 2-1 victory.

spite Matus Bero's second-half penalty rebound levelling Benedict Hollerbach's first-half opener, Bochum remain adrift on 21 points with just three matches left.

Union took the lead



shortly before halftime when Hollerbach capitalized on a defensive slip to slot home. Early in the second period, Bochum won a spot-kick, but goalkeeper Frederik Rönnow denied the initial effort. Bero pounced on the rebound to restore parity, yet Bochum could not find a winner. The draw proved costly, as relegation rivals Holstein Kiel and Heidenheim both won their 31st-round fix-tures, moving to 22 and 25 points respectively. Hoffenheim and St. Pauli also secured victories, with the latter set to conclude their match at Werder Bremen later on Sunday.

Hunger for Challenges Fuels Iyer's IPL Resurgence

Kolkata: Punjab Kings captain Shreyas Iyer has rediscovered his peak form this season, a turna-round his spin coach Sunil Joshi attributes to the batter's "relentless hunger for challenges." Since starring in India's Champions Trophy campaign, Iyer has posted unbeaten knocks of 97 and 52 in his first two IPL outings, silencing doubts over his retention. Joshi pointed to Iyer's growing consistency against both pace and spin over the past eight to ten months. "He's shown a real willingness to take on every delivery," the coach remarked ahead of Punjab's clash with his former side, Kolkata Knight Riders. "Players of his calibre don't shy away from challenge—they embrace it."

Technical adjustments have underpinned Iyer's revival. A slightly more open batting stance has improved his on-side access, while moving deeper into the crease affords him extra split-seconds to negotiate shortpitched bowling. Those tweaks, combined with rigorous off-field preparation, have yielded impres-sive returns: in five Cham-



pions Trophy matches, Iyer averaged 48.60 with four scores above 40, including a pair of fifties.

Joshi also praised Iyer's leadership, noting how the captain invests time with every squad member—even net bowlers—to build team unity. "When he speaks to players at all levels, it shows he cares about every contributor," Joshi said. "That kind of mindset bodes well for his future as a leader."

Warholm Sets Unofficial 300m Hurdles World Record at Diamond League Opener

Xiamen: Norwegian athlete Karsten Warholm set a new unofficial world record in the 300-meter hurdles, clocking 33.05 seconds at the opening Diamond League meeting on Saturday. War-holm shaved 0.21 seconds off his previous record of 33.26, set in Oslo in 2021, the same year he also set the 400-meter hurdles world record.

Although the 300-meter hurdles is not currently an Olympic event, it will soon become an official world-record discipline, as announced by World

Athletics. Warholm expressed surprise at the ease with which he completed the race. "I was a little bit surprised by how asy my legs were feeling off the last bend," he said. "Of course you feel it a little bit in the end, but I managed to really push in the last 45 meters. This shows that the speed is there and the speed over the hurdles is there."

Other Olympic champions also posted strong victories at the event. Faith Kipyegon of Kenya won the 1,000 meters with a time of 2:29.21, mov-



ing closer to Svetlana Masterkova's 1996 world record of 2:28.98. Mondo Duplantis triumphed in the pole vault, Yaroslava Mahuchikh won the high jump, Beatrice Chebet took the 5,000 meters, and Valarie Allman claimed victory in the discus.

Mayank Yadav's pace set to rise with more IPL game time, says Zaheer Khan

Mumbai: Former India seamer and Lucknow Super Giants mentor Zaheer Khan expressed confi-dence on Sunday that young pacer Mayank Yadav will regain and surpass his prior speeds as he accumu-lates more match experience in the IPL. Playing his first game since a lengthy injury layoff, Yadav impressed despite bowling slightly below his peak velocity. He returned figures of 4–0–40–2 against Mumbai Indians, dismissing Rohit Sharma (12) and Hardik Pandya (5), while consistently hitting around 140 km/h—short of the 150–155 km/h highs he reached before back and toe problems sidelined him after his India T20 debut last October.

"The wait was long, and for anyone returning after so many months, crossing that first hurdle is vital," Zaheer told reporters after LSG's 54-run defeat. "I'm happy with how he bowled and that he completed his four overs. His execution, and crucially his speed, will only improve as he plays more." Zaheer outlined the cautious approach the franchise adopted to reintegrate Mayank into competitive action. "We took our time to create a comfortable environment around him," he said.

"Fast bowling is never easy—especially in T20 when batters attack from ball one—so we wanted to ensure he was physically and mentally ready."

The LSG mentor also emphasised the ongoing collaboration with the National Cricket Academy. "We've maintained constant dialogue with the NCA—physios, trainers and I were always updated on his pro-gress. There's a clear plan for his workload and recovery, and we've structured his IPL schedule with ad-equate breaks to help him flourish." Beyond Mayank's return, Zaheer reaffirmed his faith in LSG's batting nucleus. "Nicholas Pooran, Mitchell Marsh and Aiden Markram have been our template all season, and we'll continue to back them," he said. "We encourage a fearless approach—freedom of expression at the crease has been key to our mindset."

On the other side, Mumbai's young all-rounder Naman Dhir, who struck a rapid 11-ball 25, credited the team's balanced performances for their fifth straight win. "In the last five games, we've been ticking all the boxes and winning key moments," he said. "We'll keep doing that."
